The Rotary Club pledged to provide free computer education and English language classes to the transgender community. This initiative will enable them to gain valuable skills and enhance their employability prospects.

The computer education program will cover basic computer literacy, including operating systems, internet usage, and essential software applications. Additionally, the English language classes will focus on spoken English, enabling participants to communicate effectively and confidently in professional settings.

The Division for Gender (including Transgender) Studies and Research extends heartfelt gratitude to the Rotary Club of Suratkal for their commitment to empowering the transgender community through education and skill development. Their support will undoubtedly make a substantial difference in the lives of these individuals, offering them new avenues for personal and professional growth.
